THE JURY SHORTLISTS THE 40 WORKS OF THE EU MIES AWARD 2019



Find out the <u>40 works</u> that compete in the EU Mies Award 2019 and reflect the most relevant challenges that European contemporary society and its architecture are facing: the high number of works that tackle with existing constructions; the importance that collective housing continues to have throughout Europe; the need to plan and organise the territory; and the importance of culture as a programme but also the importance of architectural culture.

• The shortlisted works are spread out in 17 different European countries. 7 of them are in France, 6 in Spain, 4 in Belgium, 3 in Austria and 3 in Denmark. Germany, Ireland, Italy, the Netherlands and Romania have 2 shortlisted works and Albania, Poland, Portugal, Serbia and Slovakia 1 work each. It is the first time that Albania, Serbia and Slovakia have a shortlisted work. You can look which works are the closest to you at App EUmiesaward.

• In the selection of 40, <u>Culture</u> is the most represented program with 15 works (museums, cultural centres, music theatres and an auditorium/congress centre). There are 6 <u>Education</u> buildings (schools, university buildings and libraries); 5 <u>Collective housing</u> works; 3 <u>Mixed use</u> constructions, 2 <u>Industrial centres</u> and 2 <u>Single houses</u>; and 1 <u>Health</u>, 1 <u>Infrastructure</u>, 1 <u>Office</u>, 1 <u>Social welfare</u>, 1 <u>Sport and Leisure</u>, and 1 <u>Urban planning</u> works.

The five finalist will be announced on February 13 and the Award Ceremony will take place on 7 May 2019 at the Mies van der Rohe Pavilion in Barcelona. Save the date for the lectures, debates, exhibition opening and celebration!
